CEO'S REPORT



It is with pleasure that I present the CEO message for the 2022 annual report.

After another year of highs and lows, challenges, and significant disruption I am fortunate to be in the position to be able to publicly thank our employees, members and business partners for your support and patience, and whose determination to continue to support Vikings through thick and thin helped us make the best of what was a very difficult year.

People before profits

This year's financial result reflects the adversity faced by the business of the past 12 months. Once again, we found ourselves shut down unable to operate at normal capacity. Approximately 80 days or close to one quarter of the year was lost again to COVID. This had a significant impact on the Club's revenues. The lockdown resulted in a cash burn of approximately \$1.5million. This was the cost of keeping the business alive, albeit on life support. A significant amount of this was spent on keeping the community engaged and our staff receiving support income. Our Board made the choice to put people before profits and as a result we were able to maintain community contributions and sustain our staff through the shutdown.

Thank you to our President Tim Hutchinson and the Board for the continued leadership and the support they provide to management and our teams.

Financial performance

While posting a loss at the end of a financial year is not ideal or indeed common for the Vikings Group, the \$800 thousand deficit is an investment in our future. If profits had been put before people the Group would not have seen 90% of our staff return to work, we would not have seen our green spaces maintained, we would not have delivered food to those in need, we would not have contributed \$2million to our community and affiliated Clubs.

We strive to continually improve our Club's performance so that we can ensure our members and their guests are able to enjoy our hospitality in modern and comfortable surrounds. We have a strong diversification program that sustains the Club in times of hardship and will provide future generations with a Club to be proud of. We continue to grow our capabilities to ensure we are ready for whatever circumstances are thrown at us.

Sustainability

Our Board and management are committed to growing our Club in a sustainable and responsible manner. It is our intention to leave our Club a better place for future generations to enjoy. As part of our Strategic plan the Club is looking at investing in the business even further to ensure the Club of the future is relevant as well as socially, financially, and environmentally sustainable. With an empowered workforce we are seeing a kaleidoscope of ideas and plans to achieve our sustainability goals. It is an exciting time to be in business and we look forward to making positive changes and improving our facilities to ensure we meet the expectations of our members and the wider community.

Our team

Our Club reflects the people that work in it every day. Good people doing great things is the fundamental principle we look to apply in our Clubs. I want to thank the cellar staff, receptionists, bar and restaurant staff, our café teams, greenkeepers, maintenance and administration teams, supervisors and management for the hard work, smiles, initiative, and resilience they have shown and continue to show. They are the reason Vikings continues to be successful.

Our community

We look forward to continuing our involvement in the support of grass roots sports in the Tuggeranong Valley. 51 affiliated Clubs proudly wear the Viking head across a vast array of sports. It's something we are proud of and will continue to celebrate. Equally we are proud of the financial assistance we provide to the various community groups in Tuggeranong. We didn't realise how valued this support was until the COVID shutdowns of the last couple of years. Our sports and community groups reached out on mass to wish us well and we are thankful for your support.

Rugby

Congratulations to our Rugby Club for the performance on and off the field this season.

The Club has a proud tradition of providing a pathway for rugby players to enable them to reach their potential. Be it playing club rugby with your mates or pulling on a Wallabies jumper, the Vikings Rugby Club has established a program that facilitates success at all levels.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT



On behalf of the Board of Directors, it is with pleasure that I provide to you the Vikings Group Annual Report for the period ending 30 June 2022.

Thankfully this financial year was much less eventful and could be best described as the Group 'finding a new normal'. However, the Club and industry in which we operate is still at the mercy of COVID-19 and the Canberra economy. In this ever-changing environment we expect these challenges to continue into future years.

Our immediate challenges include the increasing burdens placed on us by the local government, increasing costs and labour supply. To mitigate the short- and long-term ramifications of this environment our key focus remains on sustainability – socially, environmentally and financially. We will continue to listen to our almost 40.000 members to ensure that service is at the forefront of our strategic direction.

The last financial year saw glimpses of a more uniform trading pattern. The Group recorded growth in all revenue streams of the business. However, the costs of maintaining our workforce during COVID and the increased costs associated with the shortage of labour, cost of goods and almost 80 days of shutdown has resulted in a loss in the club business. In the face of these head winds the Club pushed ahead with its strategic plan of diversifying the business. The wellestablished diversification program and a responsible approach to our Club management has seen the Club remain strong and I am confident we have better years ahead.

Our staff and management are key to our performance and both the Board and members are appreciative of the considerable effort from the entire team led by our CEO Mr. Anthony Hill who this year hit a 20-year service milestone with the group. This year Vikings were fortunate to welcome Angela Morrow and Louize Glenn to our team. The board would like to specifically acknowledge the tremendous work of Ron Kent (COO) and Sarah Garland (Financial Controller).

Vikings primary Constitutional Objects are to foster and encourage Rugby Union and other sports, and provide sporting, recreation and hospitality facilities for members. Thanks to our unique club model, Vikings has been able to provide for a diverse range of social and recreational needs of our community. Today Vikings is proud to support several first-class sporting facilities, and more than 8,000 athletes and players across 41 different sports and activities in 51 affiliated clubs. As the largest private employer in the Tuggeranong Valley, we are very proud to maintain and support a diverse team that provides the product that members see every day.

Our mission is to provide first choice options in service, hospitality and facilities for our members and guests in a safe, responsible and welcoming environment. The economy and other external factors will continue to challenge us over the next financial year however the Vikings Group is prepared for ongoing industry disruption and will continue to provide sporting, recreation and hospitality facilities for members and the community more generally.

I thank our members and guests for their ongoing support as we focus on continuing to provide first class hospitality and community support. I look forward to seeing you at one of our venues or sporting events soon.

Objectives

The Club's objectives are to encourage rugby union and sport in the Tuggeranong Valley and to provide recreation and sporting facilities for its members. The Club is a not - for - profit entity.

Principal Activities

The principal activities of the Club during the financial year was running four licensed Clubs and running a pub at the Australian National University.

Strategy for Achieving Objectives

The Club provides about \$2M per annum in grants, infrastructure and other support to more than 51 sporting and community based clubs in the Tuggeranong Valley. It also maintains four licensed Club premises that provide a social outlet for over 40,000 members in the Tuggeranong Valley.

The Link Between These Activities & Achieving Objectives

The Club's 4 licensed premises earn the cash and surpluses needed to support the Club's sporting, community and social objectives.

Measuring Performance

The Club operates a Sports Council that meets monthly to co-ordinate the Club's support for all its affiliated sporting and community clubs. That body provides the feedback to allow performance measurement of all the Club's sporting and community activities. As far as the Club's licensed premises are concerned, success is measured by meeting financial targets established at the start of the year, visitation numbers, external consultants reports and benchmarking against like ACT organisations.

BASIS OF PREPARATION OF THE CONCISE FINANCIAL REPORT

The concise financial report is an extract from the full financial report for the year ended 30 June 2022. The financial statements and specific disclosures included on the concise financial report have been derived from the full financial report.

The concise financial report has been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards AASB:1039 Concise Financial Reports and the Corporations Act 2001

The financial statement, specific disclosures and other information included in the concise financial report are derived from and are consistent with the full financial report of the Club. The concise financial report cannot be expected to provide a complete understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the Club as the full financial report which is available on request.

The complete financial report and auditors report will be sent to any member via email on request, free of charge.

The presentation used in this concise report is Australian dollars.

DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL REPORT

This discussion and analysis is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report. The discussion and analysis of each statement is based on the Club's financial statements and information contained in the concise financial report. This information has been derived from the complete financial report of Tuggeranong Valley Rugby Union and Sports Club Limited.

Statement of Comprehensive Income

The Clubs result for the year ended in a loss of \$506,352 (2021: surplus of \$1,186,052). From this strong financial base the Club was able to continue to maintain our strong staffing profile during the COVID-19 pandemic, continue to provide community support through our grants programs and continued to provide key community services for our members and guests.

Statement of Financial Position

The Club increased the value of total assets by \$8.2M in the current year. This is largely due to the Club's diversification activities being further invested in over the period and the strong cash position maintained by the Club.

Total liabilities held by the Club at year end increased by \$8.6M; this is mainly due to a drawdown of a loan to finance diversification activities of the Club.

Statement of Changes in Equity

Total equity decreased by the value of the Club's deficit in the year.

Statement of Cash Flows

Cashflows indicate a decrease in Cash and Cash equivalents. This decrease has been driven by the Club's operating activities and funding provided by various bodies as part of the COVID-19 pandemic support measures such as costs to up keep clubs and payments to suppliers and employees during this period.
